## ADESA Boston 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Classic Car and Motorcycle Run Sunday, Sept. 16, to Benefit Autism Speaks

Carmel, IN—Two car guys. A shared love of classic cars and motorcycles. Twelve years and hundreds of thousands of dollars in charitable donations later, ADESA Boston has created a must-attend annual fundraising event.

The event, held at ADESA Boston, 63 Western Avenue, Framingham, Mass., runs from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Cost is \$7 per person at the door; children 12 and under are free.
